**Subject:** Defense Transportation Tracking System (DTTS) GeoFencing of the Presidential Inauguration Ceremony, Washington D.C., January 21, 2013.

**Purpose:** To inform customers and carriers of an event that will impact the shipments of DOD cargo requiring DTTS satellite oversight.

**Be Advised:** DTTS will implement a 50-mile GeoFenced perimeter for the Presidential Inauguration Ceremony Monday, January 21, 2013 at 0001 hours and ending at 2359 hours (CST).

Geo-Fencing is a feature within DTTS that allows for electronic construction of a geographic perimeter around a specific location. A DTTS monitored shipment that passes through an assigned electronic "GeoFence" boundary will generate an alert to DTTS. DTTS will coordinate with the munitions carrier's dispatcher requesting assistance in directing the truck out of this GeoFenced zone. DTTS will challenge all unauthorized arms, ammunition and explosives (AA&E) trucks entering the GeoFenced zone.

**Guidance:** Commercial carriers should use alternate routes to avoid the affected area. Carriers must provide a written copy of their AA&E route plan to shippers. Recommend DoD installations plan AA&E pick-ups or deliveries appropriately.

Transportation Officers are advised to coordinate with DTTS/SDDC for inbound/outbound AA&E / HAZMAT shipments to / from these destinations to minimize impact. Shipments needing to penetrate the zones due to operational necessity must be reported to the DTTS Duty Officer at (800) 826-0794. DTTS will manage the movement of trucks within the Geo-Fenced zone.

Carriers should call DTTS at 1-800-826-0794 or (618) 220-5060 to get assistance with emergency AA&E shipments.
