Charles D. Hayes, Jr. is the Acting Deputy to the Commanding General of the U.S. Army Military Surface Deployment and Distribution Command (SDDC). He regularly serves as Deputy Chief Counsel in the command's Office of the Staff Judge Advocate.

Charles has served as SDDC Deputy Chief Counsel for more than a decade. He entered the U.S. Army with a direct commission into the Judge Advocate General's Corps after graduating from the University of Houston Law Center and becoming a member of the Illinois bar.

Charles is a retired U.S. Army Colonel. His military education includes the Judge Advocate General's Corps Basic and Advance Courses, Combined Arms Staff School and Army Command and General Staff College.
