Bruce A. Busler was selected to the Senior Executive Service in October 2010 to serve as the U.S. Transportation Command Joint Distribution Process Analysis Center (JDPAC) director and the Military Surface Deployment and Distribution Command (SDDC) Transportation Engineering Agency (TEA) executive director.

In his role as the director, JDPAC, Busler develops a strategy to analytically support the broad needs of USTRANSCOM, Component Commands, Combatant Commands and the Services. He directs a joint team of analysts, engineers, transportation specialists, and computer scientists which includes Air Mobility Command Directorate of Analyses, Assessments and Lessons Learned (A9), as well as SDDCTEA, to provide assessments of future transportation capabilities, joint analysis to inform mobility programmatic decisions, and analytically driven deployment and distribution courses of action to move and sustain the joint force.



As the TEA Executive Director, Mr. Busler is designated as executive-level representative for the Department of Defense (DOD) on all transportation engineering matters for common-user transportation infrastructure and capabilities. Additionally, he manages the DOD Engineering for Transportability Program to ensure military equipment can be securely and safely transported on all modes of transportation. Mr. Busler also serves as the Special Assistant for Transportation Engineering to implement DOD policy guidance for highway, railroad, and ports for national defense programs.

Mr. Busler is a 2015 recipient of the Presidential Rank Award Meritorious Executive, the highest award for career executives and senior professionals in the federal government.
